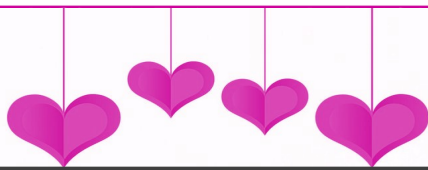

# The Village of Brady DOES NOT accept hazardous waste in dumpsters!

## There is a collection site in North Platte at 1308 N Sycamore. It is open the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month from 7 am to 1 pm and is available to all Lincoln County residents. See below for more information or call Keep North Platte and Lincoln County Beautiful.

### What is Household Hazardous Waste?

Household hazardous waste (HHW) are products found around the home that are considered:

- ◆ Flammable
- ◆ Toxic
- ◆ Corrosive
- ◆ Reactive

The average home can accumulate as much as 100 pounds of HHW per year. HHW can be found in all areas of the home including the kitchen, bathroom, garage, and garden.



### Importance of Proper Disposal

The best way to dispose of HHW is to use the product in its entirety for the purpose it was intended. Old HHW left sitting on shelves or on a basement or garage floor can present a danger to children & pets. If disposed of improperly, HHW can contaminate air, soil, surface & ground water, wastewater treatment systems, and septic tanks. Certain types of HHW have the potential to cause physical injury to sanitation workers when thrown in the trash. It is important to know which disposal method is best for each type of HHW.

### Be Safe

- ◆ Read & Follow Label Directions on the container for proper use and disposal.
- ◆ Always leave products in their original container & never remove labels. **\*\*Corroding containers require special handling. Contact the Fire Department at (308) 535-8768 for instructions.**
- ◆ When leftovers remain, never mix HHW with other products-incompatible products may react, ignite, or explode.
- ◆ Use less toxic alternatives for household products whenever possible. Contact KNPLCB for suggestions.
- ◆ Use the following guide to dispose of your household hazardous waste.

### Landfill Safe Items

The following items may be safely disposed of in a landfill. For items that need to be dried or solidified for disposal (such as glue or latex paint), you may either spread the waste on newspaper, rags, old carpet, or mix it with kitty litter or dry cement mix. Let the material dry completely before placing it in your trash.

- ◆ Aerosol cans (empty)
- ◆ Fertilizer
- ◆ Oven cleaner (lye based)
- ◆ Shoe polish

Dispose of in solid form ONLY:

- ◆ Glue (solvent based)
- ◆ Nail polish
- ◆ Paint (latex)
- ◆ Primer
- ◆ Varnish

### Recycle

#### Used Motor Oil

The City of North Platte collects used motor oil for recycling. You may drain your used motor oil into a milk jug marked 'USED MOTOR OIL' and place it next to your trash cart (if on city route). Used motor oil may also be taken to the Hazardous Waste facility at 1308 N. Sycamore or the North Platte Transfer Station at no charge. Call 535-6710 for directions to the station.



#### Printer Cartridges/Cell Phones

Keep North Platte & Lincoln County Beautiful accepts used printer cartridges and cell phones at: 715 S. Jeffers / 3rd floor (Public Safety Bldg.) or at the Senior Center 900 East 10th.

#### Batteries

Many service stations & auto supply stores will accept your used car battery. They are also accepted at the Hazardous Waste facility at 1308 N. Sycamore

Storm Drains lead directly to our river systems. **Please do not dispose of your HHW in your neighborhood storm drain. NEVER pour chemicals down a basement**

**or storm sewer which leads directly to waterways!** The following is a list of household items that may be dumped down your household sink drains in SMALL quantities. Be sure to run plenty of water with the items. Dispose of only one product at a time. When finished, rinse empty container. Read individual labels to determine if product will damage septic tanks.

#### Small quantity in house drain list:

- ◆ Alcohol based lotions & perfumes
- ◆ Aluminum cleaners
- ◆ Ammonia based cleaners
- ◆ Antifreeze (small amounts)
- ◆ Bathroom & drain cleaners
- ◆ Bleach & disinfectants
- ◆ Glue (water-based)
- ◆ Hair relaxers/removers
- ◆ Household cleaners (water-based)
- ◆ Paint brush cleaner with TSP
- ◆ Paint Stripper (lye-based)
- ◆ Photographic chemicals (small amounts)
- ◆ Rust remover (with phosphoric acid)
- ◆ Tub & Tile cleaners
- ◆ Windshield washer fluid

#### Prescription Medication:

- ◆ Unused prescription drugs can be dropped off at the main entrance of the Platte River Mall on the 3rd Saturday of each month from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

### Community Collection Site

The following products may be taken to the community collection site or a licensed hazardous waste contractor. The permanent site is located at 1308 N. Sycamore. The facility is open the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m., except on city holidays. *The collection site also accepts electronics for a fee of 40 cents per pound.*

#### Items Accepted at HHW Collection Facility:

- ◆ Auto Fluids: automatic transmission fluid, brake fluid, carburetor cleaner, car wax, fuel (gasoline, diesel, kerosene)
- ◆ Bug sprays
- ◆ Batteries (car and general)
- ◆ Car wax
- ◆ Engine degreaser
- ◆ Floor care products
- ◆ Fuel (gasoline, diesel, kerosene)
- ◆ Pesticides including: fungicides, insecticides, & herbicides
- ◆ Furniture polish & metal polish with solvent
- ◆ Lighter fluid
- ◆ Mercury thermometers
- ◆ Moth balls
- ◆ Paints/Primer/Turpentine/Varnish
- ◆ Rat poison
- ◆ Solvent-based glue
- ◆ Electronics (fee assessed)
- ◆ Fluorescent Light Bulbs

**All items must be dropped off in a closed container, weighing no more than 50 pounds or 5 gallons.**
