Attention: Village of Brady Water Consumers

If you know of anyone on dialysis, please contact and inform them of the following chlorination. They are encouraged not to use the water for cooking or drinking during this time.

This notice is provided to Village of Brady residents and water consumers only. The Village of Brady will commence treatment of its water supply through the use of chlorine (8.5% Sodium Hypochlorite)

October 4 through October 12, 2022

There will be some residual after these dates.

When chlorine is first added to a public water supply, many consumers will immediately notice a slight difference in the taste and odor of their drinking water. After 2 days most consumers will easily adjust to the difference. For those who continue to notice the chlorine tastes, it is suggested that drinking water be chilled in the refrigerator before consumption and the taste and odor will generally disappear. Residents can alternatively purchase products with activated carbon filtration such as Brita products which can effectively remove most of the chlorine and its by-products. Many local vendors supply and install under counter single supply units or whole house units.

Careful monitoring of the disinfection process and of residual chlorine levels in the distribution system will insure that consumer complaints are minimized and the new treatment process is acceptable to the consumer.

Residents with aquatic fish should use de-chlorination chemicals when changing water in aquariums. For further information regarding other pets, fish and chlorine, please consult with your local pet store.
